Handheld and sharp cutting tools, such as scissors, razors, knives, saws, and snips are used frequently on the job. Cuts and lacerations continue to be a serious problem at numerous construction sites, which is why it is important to know the correct way to use cutting tools and proper first aid if an injury does

What to Wear

The first step in protecting yourself from injury from a cutting tool is to wear the proper personal protective equipment. Some things you should always be wearing are:

- ⇒ Safety glasses
- ⇒ Safety boots
- ⇒ Hard hat



You may also want to wear additional items, depending on which type of tool you are using:

- ⇒ Gloves
- ⇒ Face shield
- ⇒ Long sleeves



TIP

Visualize the path the blade will be taking before beginning the cut. Then, be sure that no body parts will be in that path.

Knife and Cutting Tool Fundamentals

If the cutting device is needed as a work tool, it must be:

Appropriate for the job

Kept in good condition (blade sharp)

Stored properly



Preventive Measures

Always cut away from yourself Store open blade knives in sheaths Place the object being cut on a stable surface Keep blades sharp Never look away or become distracted while making the cut
