### **New Richmond Holds Open House**

More than a thousand people attended the open house held by the New Richmond School District at New Richmond's new high school on August 12th. Paul Karlen, who supervised the New Richmond project, volunteered to give visitor tours that Thursday. Before the big crowd arrived, he took time out to give me a tour of the facility.

One of our first stops was the Auditorium. The

auditorium features a stage, an orchestra pit, and seating for 799 people. From there, we went on to the band and choir rooms, locker rooms, and various classrooms.

The classrooms are equipped with projectors and interactive whiteboards that will allow lessons to be delivered in a digital format, with pictures, sounds, video clips, simulations, and even the

ability for classes to connect with classrooms and businesses outside of the school.

We then headed up to the second floor, which is laid out much like the first. As we walked, the polished concrete floors gleamed beneath our feet. These floors are not only beautiful, but a low-maintenance and easy to care for option for the school district.


## Company Website in Progress
